(B) <u>SKILL TEST</u>: 50 Marks

Only those candidates who attain a minimum-qualifying standard of 40% in the written examination will be eligible to be called for skill test. The candidates qualifying as above should be called for skill test subject to the condition that the total number of candidates called for skill test **does not exceed five times the declared vacancies**.

Syllabus for examination:

A. General Intelligence:

The questions will be of 10+2 standard and would include both verbal and non-verbal type. The test may include question to test the candidates understanding of English Language and its correct usage.

B. General Awareness:

The question will be designed to test the ability of the general awareness of the environment around the candidate and its application to society.
