(ii) Skill Test: 50 Marks

Only those candidates who attain a minimum qualifying standard of 40 % in the written examination will be eligible to be called for skill test. The candidates qualifying as above should be called for

skill test subject to the condition that the total number of candidates called for skill test does not exceed five times the declared vacancies.

II. Syllabus for examination:

A. General Intelligence:

The question will be of 10+2 standard and would include both verbal and non-verbal type. The test may include questions to test the candidates understanding English language and its correct usage.

B. General Awareness:

The questions will be designed to test the ability of the general awareness of the environment around the candidate and its application to society. Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspects as may be expected of an educated person of 10 + 2 standard. The test will also include questions related to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to History, Culture, Geography, Economic Scene, General Polity and Scientific Research.

C. Technical Knowledge:

The questions will be designed to test the knowledge and competence of the candidates' as per standard syllabus for three years' Diploma/certificate in Radiography.

D. Skill Test:

The skill test will be designed to test the practical ability and skill of the candidates' in the following fields:

- 1. Skill to interpret the requisition and carry out his duty accordingly.
- 2. Practical knowledge regarding functioning and maintenance of the X-ray machines, automatic film processors etc.
- 3. Practical knowledge regarding different contrast media, X-ray plates, different types of dark room procedures, Radiation safety, different types of views for taking radiograph.
- 4. To take X-ray as per given requisition, develop and fix the X-ray film, assess quality and adequacy of the X-ray film.
- 5. To identify in a developed X-ray, the anatomical parts, views and gross abnormalities, clinical situations in which such Radiography was ordered.
- 6. Skills of working on computer.

NOTE 1: Question paper will be set in English / Hindi except Part-II which will be set in English.

NOTE 2: There will be negative marking of 0.25 marks for each wrong answer.

NOTE 3 : Standard of questions will be of the level to commensurate with educational qualification for the post i.e. 12th standard.

NOTE 4: Visually handicapped (VH) candidates with visual disabilities of forty percent or above can avail the assistance of a Scribe in the Written Examination, subject to such requests being made at the time of applying for the examination. Question Papers and Answer Sheets will not be provided in Braille.

NOTE 5 : Persons with visual disability of less than forty percent will not be considered as visually handicapped persons. One eyed candidates and partially blind candidates who are able to read with or without magnifying glass will be allowed to use the Magnifying Glass in the Examination Hall and will not be entitled to a Scribe. Such candidates will have to bring their own Magnifying Glass to the Examination Hall.

(iv) <u>General Awareness</u>: Questions are designed to test the ability of the candidate's general awareness of the environment around him and its application to society. Questions are also designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspect as may be expected of an educated person. The test will also include questions relating to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to History, Culture, Geography, Economic Scene, General policy and scientific research.

III. TYPING TEST:

- (i) The typing test will be conducted in English or Hindi and candidates while applying for the examination, will have to indicate their option.
 - (ii) Typing test will be administered on computer, to be provided by the Factory/Unit.
- (iii) Candidates opting for English Typing shall have typing speed of 35 words per minute and those opting for Hindi typing shall their typing speed of 30 words per minute on Computer. Thirty five w.p.m. and thirty w.p.m. correspond to 10500 key depressions per hour and 9000 key depressions per hour respectively. The speed will be adjudged on the accuracy of typing on the computer of a given text passage in 10 minutes.
- (iv) Visually handicapped candidates (with 40 % disability and above) will be provided passage dictators for the typewriting test by the factory / unit. The passage dictators will read out the passage to the VH candidates within the allotted time period.

C. FIREMAN

- (b) After the written test, the candidates will be called on the basis of merit for **Physical Test** and endurance test in the ratio of 1:10 i.e. 10 times the number of vacancies. For the candidates called after written test the measurement of physical standards will be carried out first. Then only those candidates who qualify in the measurement of physical standards shall be subjected to the endurance test.

(c) The physical test & endurance test are only of qualifying in nature only and failure in these tests shall be failure in the examination i.e. the candidate who fail in any of these qualifying tests should not be considered for selection at all. Candidates will be recommended for selection on the basis of their marks or merit in the written examination only.

III. <u>SYLLABUS</u>

(i) General Intelligence:

The questions will be of 10th Standard and would include both verbal and nonverbal type. The test may include questions on analogues, similarities and differences, space visualization, problem solving, analysis, judgement, decision making, visual memory, discrimination observation, relationship concept, figure classification, arithmetical number series, verbal and non-verbal series and mathematics of 10th standard. The test will also include questions designed to test the candidate's abilities to deal with abstract ideas and symbols and their relationship, mathematical computation and other analytical functions.

(ii) General Awareness:

The questions will be 10th standard. Questions will be designed to test the ability of the candidate's general awareness of the environment around him and its application to society. Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in tieir scientific aspects as may be expected of a 10th standard educated person. The test wil also include questions relating to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to Sports, History, Culture, Geography, Economic scene, General Polity including Indian Constitution and Scientific Research, etc. These questions will be such that, they do not require a special study of any discipline.

(iii) General Awareness on Fire Fighting:

The test will include questions on knowledge of Fire fighting, operational use of Fire fighting Equipments, life saving drills, causes of fire, etc.

IV. MEASUREMENT OF PHYSICAL STANDARDS TEST & ENDURANCE TEST:

The number of candidates to be called for the measurement of physical standards test and endurance test on the basis of merit in the written test shall be in the ratio of 1:10 to the number of vacancies. The physical standards measurement test & endurance test are only of qualifying nature. The physical standards and endurance test standards will be as specified in the Essential requirements to the post given at the beginning of the advertisement.

V. Final Grading will be decided based on marks obtained in Written Test subject to qualifying in the measurement of physical standards and Endurance Test.

(i) General Intelligence:

The questions will be of 10th Standard and would include questions of non-verbal type. The test may include questions on analogues, similarities and differences, space visualization, problem solving, analysis, judgement, decision making, visual memory, discrimination observation, relationship concept, figure classification, arithmetical number series, non-verbal series. The test will also include questions designed to test the candidate's abilities to deal with abstract ideas and symbols and their relationship, arithmetical computation and other analytical functions.

(ii) General Awareness:

The questions will be 10th standard. Questions will be designed to test the ability of the candidate's general awareness of the environment around him and its application to society. Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in tieir scientific aspects as may be expected of a 10th standard educated person. The test wil also include questions relating to India and its neighbouring countries especially pertaining to Sports, History, Culture, Geography, Economic scene, General Polity including Indian Constitution and Scientific Research, etc. These questions will be such that, they do not require a special study of any discipline.

(iii) English Language:

The questions will be of 10th Standard. Candidate's understanding of the basics of English language, its vocabulary, grammar, sentence structure, synonyms, antonyms and its correct usage, etc. and writing ability would be tested.

(iv) Numerical aptitude:

(6) LANGUAGE FOR WRITTEN EXAMINATION:

II. Definition of Disabilities:

- (A) Blindness or Low Vision: The blind are those who suffer from either of the following conditions
 - (i) Total absence of sight.
 - (ii) Visual acuity not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 (Snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses.
 - (iii) Limitations of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degrees or worse.
- (B) Locomotors Disability: 'Locomotors Disability' means disability of the bones, joints or muscles leading to substantial restriction of movement of the limbs or any form of cerebral palsy.
- (C) 'Cerebral Palsy' means a group of non-progressive conditions of a person characterized by abnormal motor control posture resulting from brain insult or injuries occurring in the pre-natal, peri-natal or infant period of development.

All the cases of orthopaedically handicapped persons would be covered under the category of 'locomotors disability' or 'cerebral palsy'.

III. Competent Authority to issue Disability Certificate:

The Competent Authority to issue a Disability Certificate shall be a Medical Board duly constituted by the Central or State Government. The Central/State Government may constitute Medical Board(s) consisting of at least three members out of which at lease one should be a specialist in the particular field for assessing locomotor/cerebral/hearing/visual disability, as the case may be. The Medical Board shall, after due examination, give a permanent disability certificate in cases of such permanent disabilities where there are no chances of variation in the degree of disability. The Medical Board shall indicate the period of validity of the certificate, in cases where there are chances of variation in the degree of disability.

(8) GUIDELINES FOR FILLING ONLINE APPLICATION:

- i) Eligible applicants are required to apply On-line only. The "On-line Application Form" will be available on **Vehicle Factory's** website <u>www.vfj.nic.in</u> through a link Recruitment → Apply On-line. Application received through any other mode will not be accepted under any condition.
- ii) No hard copies of documents are required to be sent to VFJ/Jabalpur in connection with the application unless it is directed to do so.
- iii) Before registering/submitting applications on the website, the candidates should possess the following:
 - a) Valid E-Mail ID and Mobile No. The E-Mail ID and Mobile No. entered in the Online Application Form should remain valid/active until the recruitment process is completed. No change in the E-Mail ID and Mobile No. will be allowed once submitted. Please note that all information/news relating to recruitment will be communicated through e-mail and SMS only. Therefore, the candidate himself/herself will be responsible for non-receipt of any communication in case of wrong or expired E-Mail ID & Mobile No.
