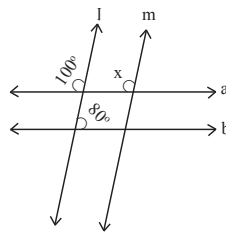

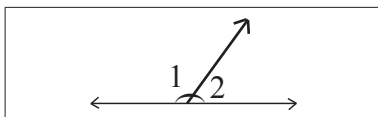
Machines were invented to satisfy the growing demands of the new markets. If merchants were to make the most of the opportunities offered by these markets, it was essential to increase output and reduce prices. In all this development, Great Britain took the lead. There were several reasons for this. First, British expansion had opened foreign markets which were ready to absorb more and cheaper goods. There was in India, for example an almost unlimited market for common goods and in fact, for cheap goods of all kinds. Second, Britain possessed the enormous advantage of having an ample supply of coal and iron, the two materials most necessary for building of machinery. Finally, the British rose to the situation by introducing a series of important innovations.
